

Although under the remit of the Police, the Parish Council is considering buying the equipment to run a community speed watch group provided that enough Bilbrook residents sign up.








HAVE YOUR SAY - When should wreaths be removed after Remembrance Sunday?

You may have noticed piles of grass or maybe even a tractor pulling a special bit of machinery in Bilbrook recently. The grass on 4 separate plots of land in the village has been cut and the arisings taken away. This is a departure from the normal way the grass is cut in the district. This allows the flowers to set seed so they will come back next year. It also means that the wild flowers can grow to maturity, which is better for our pollinators.

The other positive thing is that the longer vegetation created habitats for our wildlife. We have even noticed cherry tree and hazel saplings growing which would normally have been cut down under the old cutting regime.

So it's more positive news for nature in Bilbrook and each year we should see more and more wild flowers emerge as the ground loses its fertility. This experimental way of managing the land is a partnership between the Friends of Bilbrook, South Staffordshire Council, Bilbrook Parish Council and Plantlife - the wild flower charity. The new management program will be infinitely better for wildlife and should give us something different to look at rather than just grass which we have become accustomed to seeing.
