NO 5 BUS SERVICE SAVED!

Bilbrook Parish Council and residents alike have been very disappointed at the sudden changes to the No 5 bus service. We thank the Bilbrook residents who came to our October Parish meeting to voice their concerns. These were passed to County Councillor Bob Spencer, who has reacted quickly to address the situation. Cllr Spencer has provided the following statement.

"You will be aware, in a surprise move a few weeks ago, the operator of our number 5 bus, National Express, decided to withdraw the service. Our essential bus services are vital to many of our residents and following the announcement, I received numerous complaints . Listening to

to people's concerns about the loss of this service, whether simply going shopping, or getting to school, college, or health care appointments, helped reinforce my belief in the absolute need for effective, integrated public transport. However, although councils have responsibilities around public transport, they don't run buses, bus companies do. In addition, National Express made it clear the route was just not financially viable. A point echoed by residents who have told me they often see it almost empty, or that most passengers get off in Whitmore Reans and they are often the only passenger travelling to Bilbrook and Codsall. Since the announcement I have been in continual contact with various operators and transport organisations. Given the poor usage of the service, it quickly became clear that the only way to maintain any service would be with the provision of subsidies. Subsidies are hugely expensive and as you can imagine, fiercely contested as many local communities want them. After a great deal of

negotiation, I am extremely pleased to say, I have been successful in securing sufficient subsidies to retain the service, almost in its entirety. For full details and route maps, the tenders are out and publicly available on the midlands transport website. In brief, the times are as advertised with additional subsidised services shown here." - Bob Spencer, County Councillor.

Bilbrook Parish Council thanks Cllr Spencer for his work to resolve this issue for Bilbrook residents.

Banga buses take over the No 5 service on Monday 6th November. They will accept the same bus passes as National Express. The maximum adult fare will be the same as National Express (Currently capped at £2) All of their buses are DDA compliant; can be lowered and has wheel chair accessibility. CLIMATE EMERGENCY AND BILBROOK CLIMATE ACTION GROUP



At it's September 2023 meeting Bilbrook Parish Council (BPC) agreed to declare a climate emergency. Our aim is to make BPC carbon neutral by 2030 and encourage residents, organisations and businesses to work with us to reduce pollution, their carbon footprint and protect and improve the environment.

Councillor Annette Lloyd said: Scientists tell us we are no longer in a state of Global warming but now we are in Global Boiling. We are at a tipping point regarding climate change. Each of us must ensure every time we decide on such things as travel, purchasing, heating our homes, that we consider our individual impact on climate change. As a Parish Council we want to be ambitious, challenging our systems, values, and work; looking for ways to become more adaptive and responsible.

We believe that the Parish Council has a unique part to play in affecting change by all. And, by coming together as a community we can have a greater impact. As a community we need to make the climate emergency a priority. Our declaration of a climate emergency is just the beginning in our determination to effect and inspire change. In doing this, we aim to provide a better future for our children and grandchildren. The Parish Council has already made some changes to reduce their carbon footprint including paperless meetings and tree planting.

BPC is setting up a Climate Action Group made up of residents and Parish Councillors to develop an action plan looking at future initiatives such as; installing EV chargers in the village, more wildflower meadows, and further habitat restoration on Banks Field working with Staffordshire Wildlife Trust. BLOOR CONSULTATION FOR NEW BUILDING PHASE

Bilbrook residents should have received a consultation leaflet from Bloor Development at the beginning of October which shows their plans for the next phase of housing at sites off of Pendeford Mill Lane and Lane Green Road. Residents have informed the council that not everyone received the leaflet in time to give feedback before the original deadline. The Parish Council contacted Bloor and they have agreed to extend the deadline to Friday 4th November (Apologies to any households that receive the Buzz after the deadline as the time scales were tight to get this out)



We encourage all residents to give their feedback. The Bilbrook Neighbourhood Plan committee is also reviewing the proposal and will give feedback based on the draft policies currently being written. You may have noticed that fencing has recently been put up around the former Grange pub.. It is the Parish Councils understanding that the pub is to be demolished and a care home built in it's place. Sadly, the building is damaged beyond repair. Thanks goes to our local PCSO's, Parish and District Councillors who have been pushing for this for many years due to the anti-social behaviour around the property.

The planning application relating to the development of the site was updated in June. As the application was already approved and "live" the Parish Council is not consulted on any amendments to the plans in line with National Planning Policy.
