

# Bilbrook Jubilee Walks

The walk is approximately 2.5 miles and is relatively easy although, as some areas may be muddy at times, the wearing of suitable outdoor clothing and footwear is advised

## Introduction/Route

- The walk begins at the junction of Pendeford Hall Lane with Middle Lane (a Public Right of Way).
- Behind this is the site of Pendeford Hall, now a mobile home park, which was once the seat of the Fowler family, the principal landowners in the area.
- The walk proceeds along Middle Lane and almost immediately crosses the course of a Roman road before veering left and heading north east.
- Just before the new bridge over the M54, the walk turns right into the i54 site
- The perimeter of i54 is skirted as the route swings southwards.
- The walk proceeds through Clewley Coppice, an Ancient Semi-Natural Woodland. This was associated with Clewley House, which once stood on the right of the walk.
- The path joins Wobaston Road and the route swings right, skirting playing fields on the right.
- Further down on the right is a former Shooting Pit.
- A short distance beyond this, the walk turns right along Pendeford Hall Lane, broadly following the course of the Roman road referred to above.

## Species

### In the grassland, shrubs and trees

#### Mammals and Amphibians

Grey squirrels, Frogs, Yellow neck mice, Wood mice, Hares, Foxes and Rabbits.

#### Birds

Lapwings, Sparrows, Sparrowhawks, Buzzards, Herons, Robins, Blue tits, Goldfinches, Magpies, Wood pigeons, Stock doves, Greenfinches, Blackbirds, Jays, Collared doves, Grey wagtails, Kingfishers, Tawny owl, Little owl and Great tits.

#### Butterflies

Small tortoiseshell, Gatekeeper, Ringlets and Red admirals.

#### Insects and other

Bumblebees, Damselfly or Broadwater damsel fly, Southern Hawker Dragonfly, Grasshopper, Cardinal beetles, Ladybirds, and Honeybees, Red tail bumblebees, Marmalade bumblebees, Hoverflies and White lipped snails.

#### Plants

Bilba, Hawthorn, Elder and Hazel.

#### Trees

Ash, Alder, Oak, Pine and Sycamore.
