BILBROOK PARISH COUNCIL NEWS



UPGRADE OF BILBROOK PLAYPARK



BILBROOK ALLOTMENTS

There is nothing like growing seasonal fresh fruit and vegetables. When picked and eaten soon after, they are much tastier than shop-bought produce. There are other benefits too:

- Working your plot will keep you physically fit.
- Being in the sunshine is a good source of Vitamin D.
- Being outside is good for your mental health and instils a sense of wellbeing and calm.
- Working your plot with your family can be fun and is an excellent way of bonding with them.
- You will meet other plot holders of a variety of ages and backgrounds.

How much does it cost? The cost from April 2022 will be £20 for the year for a half plot.

Bilbrook Parish Council were successful in their bid for funding to improve the centre of Bilbrook and make it more welcoming to visitors. The Parish Council has so far used the funding to purchase at beach and plants

far used the funding to purchase a bench and plants for the Village Green and is about to embark on a programme of cleaning and weeding the pavements around the centre of the Village. ROADSIDE VERGES

One topic that the Parish Council receives the most complaints about is the grass verges. Although the grass verges around the Parish are owned by Staffordshire County Council and maintained by South Staffs Council, the Parish Council still has a say in their maintenance.

When we talk about cutting the verges, we divide them into those that are short cut (currently eight times a year) mainly to improve visibility for road users and those that are tall cut (twice a year)

Tall cut verges are left uncut between spring and late summer to allow wildflowers to grow and support an abundance of insects such as bees and butterflies. In Bilbrook four areas have been designated as tall cut verges - Duck Lane, Bilbrook Road, Lane Green Road and Wobaston Road.




With over 97% of meadows destroyed since the 1930s, road verges are a vital refuge for pollinators and other wildlife.

JOIN OUR NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN STEERING GROUP



WHAT IS A NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN?

A Neighbourhood Plan is a document describing the desired plans for a village over a 5-10 year period and covers those areas the majority of residents feel are important. It covers topics such as housing and development, schooling and amenities, environmental protection, transport and highways. The document requires substantial consultation with everyone in the village. It also involves planning and work to bring it all together.

Once the village has agreed on its content, South Staffordshire District Council must approve it. It is not a way to get property development through and pass unwanted schemes in the village without consultation. Equally, it can not stop development that is already planned.

Due to the work involved in producing a Neighbourhood Plan, additional people to Parish Councillors are needed. To work effectively the steering group membership should be between 10 and 15 and ideally reflect the character and diversity of the local population, with people from different places in the area and different sections of the community.

Relevant skills and experience that may be useful to the steering group include:

- project management
- familiarity with the planning system
- community engagement
- marketing, promotion and consultation
- expertise in specific topic areas. e.g. planning, transport, the environment.
- -writing, editorial, graphic design skills
