Meeting held on Wednesday, 4th October at 7:00 pm at Bilbrook Village Hall Minutes

Public Forum: 15 people including a journalist from the Express & Star Newspaper were in attendance.

No 5 Bus – A statement from County Councillor Bob Spencer was read out by the Chairman I have been in regular contact with our 'connectivity team' who are the people who deal with all forms of public transport in Staffordshire. Unfortunately, I can't make Wednesday's meeting as I have a prior appointment. However, can I provide the following information for any concerned residents. As I'm sure you know, councils don't run buses, bus companies run buses and .. we don't 'give out' contracts. These decisions are commercial decisions, akin to the recent bank branch closures we've seen in our villages. They are commercial organisations making commercial decisions. It is worthy of note that National Express who previously ran the service, withdrew stating it was simply not commercially viable. The number of people using the service, particularly off-peak had reduced significantly, an issue common to all forms of public transport. A legacy of post-Covid working from home, amongst other things. I have been in negotiation with our liaison officers and there may be an opportunity to tender for the off-peak service. Unfortunately, while we have an existing provider it is illegal to tender for the entire service. Naturally, this provision would involve some form of subsidy. We are in the process of precisely establishing the demand, but I anticipate a decision will be made this week. I am pushing hard for a positive outcome. I will get back to you once I get an answer. Regards, Bob

Several people raised concerns about the No.5 bus which is to be operated by Banga buses from November. These concerns will be passed to Staffordshire County Councillor B Spencer along with a request for a public meeting. The main concerns were:

- the bus frequency It will go from one every 30 minutes through Bilbrook to one an hour.
- the times the buses run There is no service on a Sunday. The first bus from Bilbrook is at 7:30 a.m. & the last bus at 6:00 p.m. (Currently times are 6:00 a.m. and 11:45 p.m.) The first bus from Wolverhampton to Bilbrook is at 7:00 a.m. and the last is at 6:30 p.m. (Currently 6:20 a.m. and 11:30 p.m.)
- The condition of the Banga buses and in particular if they are accessible.

The members of the public have asked that Cllr Spencer to:

- discuss subsiding buses outside the hours No. 5 operates.
- look into whether elderly and disabled residents can use their bus passes on the trains into Wolverhampton.
- hold a meeting to listen to residents' concerns.

Members of the public were asked to contact Cllr Spencer directly if they have any other concerns.

The Parish Council is not happy that the first they knew of the changes to the no.5 bus was from residents.

It was resolved to move agenda item 058/23b, a presentation by Sulis Public Affairs, Bloor Homes and Evolve Planning on the consultation relating to the next phase of the development off Pendeford Mill Lane, to the Public Forum to allow members of the public to ask questions.

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They explained that the houses would be built on the safeguarded land that was removed from the Greenbelt in the 2018 local plan and that South Staffs District Council is in the process of reviewing the Local Plan. The consultation relating to the next phase of the development off Pendeford Mill Lane is to find out what type of house residents want. 40% of the houses will be affordable homes. The green spaces will be maintained by a management company. Councillors and members of the public raised concerns about:

- the increase in traffic on the roads that cannot cope with the current levels of traffic.
- the impact on the Woodman junction which is already very dangerous.
- the new island on Pendeford Mill Lane which does not solve any of the current traffic issues
- the creation of wildlife corridors after existing corridors have been destroyed
- vehicle access onto Lane Green Road
